

Lawful Notice of Rights

I have the lawful right to enter, shop and be served at this business As Protected by Law- without covering my face

 This lawful business has a Legal Classification as a "public accommodation" according to U.S.Constitution Title III Reg 28 CFR § 36.104. Your business serves the public and therfore must abide by all state and federal laws. No business policy supersedes U.S. Law. No governor's order, health order, emergency or pandemic supersedes our Constitutionally-protected rights. This business is open to the public, and I am the public. Your denial of my service violates several federal laws.

2. U.S. Law 28 CFR §36.202 prohibits "denial of participation" from this business establishment.§ 36.202(c) states that unless I have been individually assessed as a "direct threat" you may not exclude me from the Same and Equal services as others.

3. Denying my service or requiring me to be served outside or be limited to home delivery is a Violation of Title II, III, and VII of the U.S. Civil Right Act of 1964.

4. Title III, Section § 36.202(a)(b)(c) and § 36.203(a)(b)(c) state that I shall not be denied the same Participation and Equal Access as everyone else. The law prohibits you from serving me separately or differently.

5. As such, this business is Prohibited from unlawful discrimination by denying the entry of any of the People of the public who are not disturbing the peace. To do so is a crime of FALSE IMPRISONMENT, and you will be held personally liable for this crime.

6. These premises are open to the public and thus any charge of "trespass" is a false accusation, as I am complying with all lawful conditions allowing me to remain on these premises.

41-1492. <u>Definitions</u> In this article, unless the context otherwise requires:

1. "Americans with disabilities act" means 42 United States Code sections 12101 through 12213 and

47 United States Code sections 225 and 611 and the ADA amendments act of 2008 (P.L. 110-325; 122 Stat. 3553).

8. "Major life activities" includes:

(a) Caring for oneself, performing manual tasks, seeing, hearing, eating, sleeping, walking, standing, lifting, bending, speaking, breathing, learning, reading, concentrating, thinking, communicating and working.

(b) The operation of a major bodily function, including functions of the immune system, normal cell growth and digestive, bowel, bladder, neurological, brain, respiratory, circulatory, endocrine and reproductive functions. 11. "Public accommodation" includes any: (a) Inn, hotel, motel or other place of lodging, except for an establishment located within a building that contains not more than five rooms for rent or hire and that is actually occupied by the proprietor of the establishment as the residence of the proprietor. (b) Restaurant, bar or other establishment serving food or drink. (c) Motion picture house, theater, concert hall, stadium or other place of exhibition or entertainment. (d) Auditorium, convention center, lecture hall or other place of public gathering. (e) Bakery, grocery store, clothing store, hardware store, shopping center or other sales or retail establishment. (f) Laundromat, dry cleaner, bank, barber shop, beauty shop, travel service, shoe repair service, funeral parlor, gas station, office of an accountant or lawyer, pharmacy, insurance office, professional office of a health care provider, hospital or other service establishment. (g) Terminal, depot or other station used for specified public transportation. (h) Museum, library, gallery or other place of public display or collection. (i) Park, zoo, amusement park or other place of recreation. (i) Nursery, elementary, secondary, undergraduate or postgraduate private school or other place of education. (k) Day care center, senior citizen center, homeless shelter, food bank, adoption agency or other social service center establishment. (I) Gymnasium, health spa, bowling alley, golf course or other place of exercise or recreation. 12. "Public entity" means

any: (a) State or local government. (b) Department, agency, special purpose district or other instrumentality of a state or local government, including the legislature.
